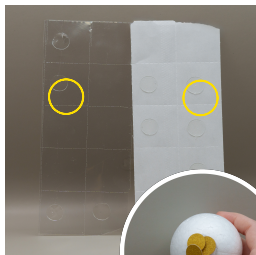


Christmas Ornament Instructions

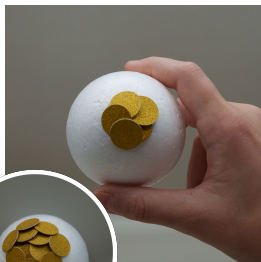
Your task is to glue paper discs onto a foam plastic ball using adhesive dots. You will do this along eight circles. The end result will be a sparkling pinecone.

Remove the transparent film from the adhesive dots either one by one or for example in two rows. The adhesive dot may stay on either the film or paper. If removing the film is difficult, press the adhesive dot through the film onto the backing paper and try again. Place the paper discs onto the adhesive dots. Pull the disc with the adhesive dot off the backing paper.

Start creating the pinecone along the drawn circle. This will become the bottom end of the pinecone. Glue 5 discs to the first circle. Glue the discs in a scale-like pattern, overlapping each other. Cover the bottom circle partially with the next circle. You can add discs with slightly larger gaps. Glue about 8 discs to the second circle.



Start each new circle so that the disc covers the gap between two upper discs.

Glue 12 discs to the third circle.

Glue 14 discs to the fourth circle.

Glue 15 discs to the fifth circle.

Glue 14 discs to the sixth circle.

Glue 12 discs to the seventh circle.

After each circle, you can check if the discs are evenly distributed and adjust them. Make sure to press the discs firmly one more time with your fingers.



For the last circle, glue 6 to 8 discs so that the upper end of the pinecone is covered. Leave space to insert the hanging loop into the foam ball. Put the loop through the cork and push the hanging loop into the foam ball. If needed, ask for adult help as this requires strong pressure.

Tie a string to the hanging loop. Instead of the provided string, you can use black thread, making the ornament look even more like a pinecone on the tree. After extended periods and as the adhesive dots dry, some paper discs might come loose from the ball. You can reattach these using rubber cement or hot glue.
